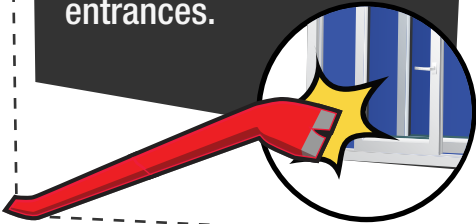
Your home is your safe haven, and here's what you can do to protect your family and belongings.



HOW DOES A BURGLAR BREAK IN TO YOUR HOME?

INTRUDER ALERT!

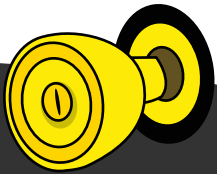
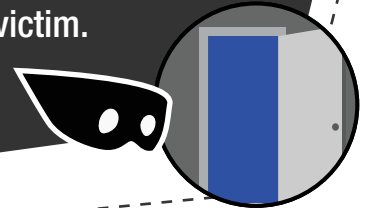
Entering or forcing through unsecured doors or other entrances.



Impersonating as a technician, a delivery service officer, or door-to-door salesman who will attempt to linger in your house to check for easy access into your house premises.



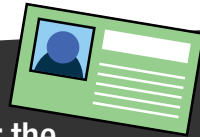
Waiting for the victim to enter or leave the premises and then forcing his way in together with the victim.



KEEP BURGLARS OUT!

Never open your house doors or gate to strangers. Stay in your house or compound when conversing with them.

Always ask for the identification of anyone who claims to be a salesman, or a technician, or an employee of any organisation.



Keep grill gates padlocked at all times, so that burglars cannot rush or force their way in.

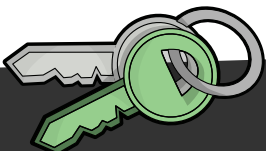
Inform family members in advance if someone unknown is being sent to the house, and if in doubt call the police if you sense anything suspicious.



HOW TO AVOID YOUR HOUSE FROM BEING A TARGET

Do not keep a spare key outside your house.

It may be convenient to keep one stashed under a flower pot or in the shoe cabinet, but this is usually the first place a burglar looks in order to get into your home.



If you're going to be away, leave a light on to give the impression that someone is at home and inform your nearest neighbourhood police as well as your close neighbours that you will be away.



Invest in a good security alarm system.
